

# SUNDAY No 67 - WORLD PUZZLE by GOZO

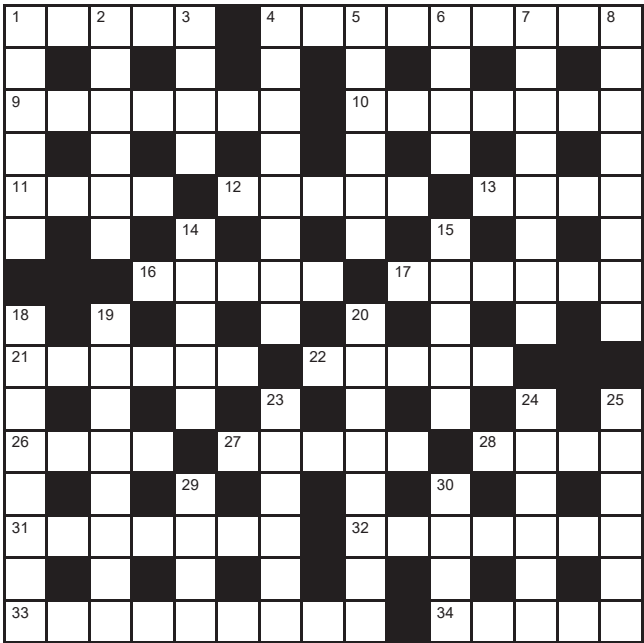
